Dear Student,

We would like to thank you for your patience during these difficult and uncertain times.

Following the recent announcements from the Prime Minister, we understand that it is safe for the following groups of students to continue attending lessons on site should they want to do so. These students are:

- All Nido Volans students from Bromley, Bexley and Greenwich campuses
- All students on mainstream courses with an EHCP and or a Social Care Assessment

Please note that students who have been receiving free school meals will be given £10 per week in online vouchers for the next two weeks.

In addition, we will continue to support the following:

- All work-based assessment and delivery, including apprenticeships and traineeships where possible. This excludes classroom delivery.
- All work experience placements that have been previously arranged and where it is safe to continue.

**However, in line with government guidance, we have had to make the decision to transfer the following courses to online/ remote learning until further notice from 12:00pm Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> March.**

These courses include:

- All full and part time study programmes
- All full and part time adult programmes and courses
- All higher education courses
- All traineeships and apprenticeships delivery taking place in the classroom
- All commercial courses (such as AAT)

From Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> March, online learning programmes will be put in place for students who are not required to attend a College campus, this includes full and part time study programmes, full and part time adult programmes and Greenwich Adult and Community courses, all higher education programmes and all traineeships and apprenticeships delivered in the classroom.

At this point in time, we do not expect the college campuses to be re-open to all learners before the start of the Summer Term, Monday 20<sup>th</sup> April. In the case that the college remains closed to most
